Arbor Day in the Back Bay Fens

It is with great pleasure that Maltby & Company announces plans to celebrate Arbor Day 2011 together with the City of Boston. The Maltby family, who have been celebrating Arbor Day for more than 40 years, have this year chosen to contribute their professional resources to the Fenway community.

The project will span a large section of the park from the Fenway Victory Gardens to Avenue Louis Pasteur. Joining Maltby in this ambitious project will be Emerald Necklace Conservancy, Fenway Civic Association, and Fenway Garden Society who have undertaken tree improvement projects of their own.

Arbor Day was coordinated by the Massachusetts Arborists Association (MAA) as an event where many arborists and "green" companies would come together for a day of service on a property chosen by the MAA to improve the safety, aesthetics and health of the plants and trees at that site. Some of the early sites included Franklin Park, The Crane Estate in Ipswich and Larz Anderson Park in Brookline. Last year Maltby and Company spent their day at the Dimock Hospital in Roxbury.

Recently, Arbor Day has evolved and grown into many different events at many locations, each chosen by a single company. Although the structure of the event has changed throughout the years, the mission has not. "Arbor Day provides us with a wonderful opportunity for our company to give something back to the community" said Bill Maltby, speaking of his family's pride in continuing their tradition of Arbor Day giving. "We want to help communities by helping their trees live long, healthy lives."
